WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

As senior leaders, students explore the concept of leadership as influence, focusing on self-awareness, connection, and practical skills to lead effectively.

WORKSHOP OUTCOMES

For each participant to:

- Comprehensively define leadership
- Understand that leadership is more powerful when operating as a team
- Learn to build better connections with one another and younger students
- Leading themselves and others through vulnerability and support
- Identify personal challenges and barriers to success

HOW TO BEST SUPPORT DURING THESE WORKSHOPS

- **Be alongside the youth:** Engage fully and participate as if you were one of the students. Your involvement sets the tone for collaboration and connection.
- **Model authentic leadership:** Share personal examples of leadership, including moments of vulnerability or growth, to inspire and encourage students.
- **Foster teamwork:** Encourage students to see leadership as a shared responsibility, emphasizing the power of working together to achieve common goals.
- **Encourage reflection:** Guide students to think about their leadership strengths and areas for growth by asking open-ended questions like, "What makes a leader someone you trust or respect?"
- **Support their journey:** Be attentive to students as they explore leadership challenges, offering encouragement and affirming their potential to lead through small but meaningful actions.
- **Celebrate connection:** Highlight the importance of building strong relationships with peers and younger students, reinforcing that leadership is about influence and support.
